Outreach Activities:

- One of WTVI PBS Charlotte's most popular outreach events is our behind-the-scenes studio tours, offering a unique and engaging experience to our community, including information about career opportunities in broadcasting. Over the course of 20 tours from June to July, we welcomed 430 attendees who had the opportunity to delve into the fascinating world of television production June 2025.
- This year PBS Charlotte participated in career job fair at NC Works' February 7, 2025, event for opportunities in broadcasting. One of WTVI's journalists participated in the event.
- Annual required training of all personnel as to methods of ensuring equal employment opportunity and preventing discrimination. All trainings were completed by July 1, 2025.
- WTVI/CPCC also hosted internships for three students of broadcasting from Central Piedmont Community College (two interns) and Carolina School of Broadcasting (one intern). Two of the interns worked at WTVI during the 2024 Fall Semester and one intern worked during the Spring 2025 Semester. Internship Program is designed to provide college students a practical and valuable experience that complements their major field of study. The program creates meaningful, hands-on experiences and gives students a glimpse into the world of public media. Interns work on key projects and are actively involved in business-critical work; they gain a global view of PBS by working collaboratively within their teams and across departments. This is a year-long fellowship program that embeds promising filmmakers and rising executives into existing productions, to help them gain the experience necessary to advance their careers. In addition to supporting filmmakers, it will accelerate changes in the producing ecosystem by bringing more voices into the production process, and creating a wider pool of diverse candidates who make significant contributions to public media in both producing and executive roles.
